ENIE 012 Intensive English Level 2 (12 hours per week)

This course continues the process of developing students' general abilities in English, so that they will be able to start preparing directly for the Test of English as a Foreign Language (ITP TOEFL) in level 3.It aims to further expand vocabulary, increase proficiency in reading, writing and listening, develop greater understanding of grammatical rules and usage, and encourage students to be independent learners in the computer lab and library.

Prerequisite: ENIE 011 or Placement Test or equivalent; Semester offered: 1 & 2

What are the objectives of this course?

- To understand spoken English by listening to recordings of short and long conversations
- To read passages and answer questions related to the reading
- To expand the vocabulary through reading and listening
- To write grammatically correct sentences and paragraphs

<u>Learning outcomes: What will I learn to do as a result of taking this course, if I study</u> <u>effectively?</u>

- 1. Identify grammatical errors and correct them
- 2. Locate and comprehend the main ideas & important details in reading passages in Intermediate English and be able to infer the meanings of new words from the context
- 3. Understand spoken information and identify main ideas and supporting details in listening materials
- 4. Write grammatically correct sentences with adequate vocabulary

How students' learning outcomes will be assessed

- Grammar quizzes + Midterm exam + Final exam = **29%**
- Reading quizzes + Lab (Clarity) + Library (graded readers) + Midterm exam + Final exam = 22%
- Listening quizzes + Lab (Clarity) + Midterm exam + Final exam = 22%
- Vocabulary quizzes + Midterm exam + Final exam = **11%**
- Writing quizzes + Midterm exam + Final exam = **16%**
