ENIE 013 Intensive English Level 3 (12 hours per week)

This course prepares students for the Test of English as a Foreign Language (ITP TOEFL). It focuses on the three sections of that test (Listening, Structure and Written Expression, Reading), paying special attention to expanding vocabulary. In addition, it offers help for students planning to take the IELTS exam as an alternative to the TOEFL. Students take the TOEFL as their mid-term and final exam in this course.

Prerequisite: ENIE 012 or Placement Test or equivalent; Semester offered: 1 & 2

What are the objectives of this course?

- To understand spoken English by listening to recordings of short and long conversations
- To read academic passages and answer questions related to the reading
- To expand academic vocabulary through reading and deep processing activities
- To write grammatically correct short and long essays

<u>Learning outcomes: What will I learn to do as a result of taking this course, if I study effectively?</u>

- 1. Identify grammatical errors and correct them
- 2. Locate and comprehend the main ideas & important details in reading passages in Intermediate English and be able to infer the meanings of new words from the context

- 4. Write grammatically correct sentences with adequate vocabulary
